1. A brief description of the course

- a. This course is designed to deepen students' understanding the features of contemporary gender politics.
- b. The course defines the place and role of gender component in the global and national historical process.
- c. Theoretically the course is based on modern historiographical concepts and methodological research in gender history. The course's purpose is to show the heuristic capabilities and integrated potential of gender analysis in historical development.

2. Objective of the course

The course is focused on mastering a holistic understanding of the major topics and research approaches toward gender historical research in order to familiarize students with the modern concepts, models and methods of gender analysis used in practice of gender-historical research, to show ways of integration of gender mainstreaming in specific historical and political research, as well as new interpretation of the past that are created on its base

3. Learning outcomes

After successful completion of the course, the students should be able to:

- know the theoretical and methodological principles of historical gender studies;
- be able to identify the role and place of both sexes in history;
- determine the regulatory status of man and woman in different historical periods;

- examine history through the prism of gender, i.e. as a history of integrated interaction considering and identifying male and female experience;
- analyze the relationship of both sexes in the historical context; • carry out independent research on gender history;

4. Teaching method

Lectures and workshops using problematic methods and interactive teaching methods; consultation; independent work in libraries and computer networks.

7. Course schedule

Topic 1: Gender History as a special historical discipline

Students are encouraged to pay attention to the following issues:

Week 1.

1. The background and circumstances of "women's history". "Woman's invisibility" in the historical process.

2. Gerd Lehner and her work "New approaches to the study of women in American history."
3. The problem of Androcentrism in History. The emergence of hinocentric history.

Week 2.

1. Scope and methodology of gender studies in late 1960 - early 1970th: evolution of research tasks.
2. Neo-Marxist Feminism Perspective and expansion of social and class analysis.
3. Ways to reflect sexual inequality.

Week 3.

1. The history of women in the context of the social history.
2. Updating feminist theory and methodology at the turn of 1970 - 1980 th.
3. Synthetic model of gender by Joan Scott.

Week 4.

1. Relationship between the concepts of class and gender, gender and social hierarchy.
2. Changes in the subject, problems, methods and source basis of research in 1980th. Transition from the history of women to the gender history.

At the end of the study the students should write one an essay the topic.

Topic 2: Gender asymmetry in marriage and family: a historical dimension

The students are invited to consider the following issues:

Week 5.

1. Marriage and family institutions in gender-historical research, their key characteristics, evolution and differentiation.
2. The problem of coercion and freedom in choosing a partner.

Week 6.

1. Evolution of marriage patterns and character of intrafamily relations.
2. Marriage and family in Ukraine and world history from ancient times to the present through the prism of gender ideas.

For a better learning students are invited to view a series of excerpts of popular movies of ethnographic orientation. After the study of the topic the students do independent creative project.

Topic 3. Gender in economics: division of labor and control of property in world history

Students are encouraged to pay attention to the following issues:

Week 7.

1. The role of women in economic life in Ancient Times, the Middle Ages and Early Modern Times.

2. The transformation of gender relations in connection with the genesis of capitalism.
3. Duality of women status changes in the economy of transition period as a result of changes in the understanding of the working activity Marginalization of women's labor and the problem of the labor reserve.

Week 8.

1. The role of gender identity in the evaluation of the labor quality and its pay.
2. Guild ideology and its gender orientation.
3. Gender asymmetry in access to property management, its social differentiation.

At the end of the study students should prepare presentation of selected issues.

Topic 4: Gender and Power: the History

The following questions are the focus of students' discussion on this topic:

Week 9.

1. The system of power relations in society. Legitimate power, formal authority and informal influence.
2. The role of gender in the division of powers.
3. The manifestation of gender hierarchy at different levels.
4. Historical changes of the configuration of the private and public sectors from ancient times to the present.

Week 10.

1. The concept of «women's power». Tools and forms of influence of women on decision-making in the public sector.

2. Women "networks of influence" in the concrete historical personalization (according to examples of Ukrainian and world history).
3. The political aspect of gender differentiation in world and national history.

Week 11.

1. "Two bodies" of the ruler and the concept of "split identity": gender or rank in political history.
2. Women in the Revolution: political activity in the light of the issue of rights and responsibilities.
3. Metaphor of division of spheres as a way of fixing gender inequality and as a theoretical model of "women's history".

The final stage of the study of the topic is to prepare students written work "Woman in Politics / revolution".
